### FAR EAST BUILDING

Nestled in the historic core of Little Tokyo, the Far East Building stands as a tribute to the resilience and rich legacy of the Japanese American community. Once home to the *Far East Daily*, one of the first Japanese American newspapers in the region, this iconic structure has been thoughtfully restored to serve today's community while honoring its past.

The surrounding community offers a dynamic mix of restaurants, grocery stores, cultural institutions, and small businesses—many of which are locally owned and operated—creating a walkable, supportive environment for residents of all ages.

## There is no on-site parking available, but metered street parking, as well as paid parking lots, are accessible nearby.

Residents of the Far East Building, have easy access to several major freeways or public transit, making commuting and traveling around the city convenient. There is also a metro station, bus stops, and dash line, all within a block from the community. The most accessible freeways from this location are:

- US-101: Just a few blocks away, it provides quick routes north toward Hollywood and the San Fernando Valley or southeast toward East L.A.
- I-10: Easily accessible via surface streets, this freeway connects residents west toward Santa Monica or east toward the Inland Empire.
- I-5: A major north-south artery through California, accessible via nearby connectors.
- I-110: Runs south toward the port of Los Angeles and north into downtown and the Pasadena area via the 110 North transition to the Arroyo Seco Parkway.

These freeway and public transportation connections make the Far East Building an ideal location for individuals and families who rely on both public transportation and freeway access for work, school, and daily life.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

The Head of Household (Primary Applicant) must be 18 years of age or older.

The Household's annual income may not exceed the applicable income limits:

#### Income Limits (2025) 1 Person 2 Persons \$48,550 \$55,450

The unit must be the household's only residence.

All applicants meet screening criteria (i.e., landlord verification, criminal background check).
